A word from our student leaders :)



On the 16th of February, our school's year 6 youth leaders went to Melbourne convention and exhibition centre (also known as Jeff's Shed). We all arrived at school at 7:50 - 8:00 am, used Public Transport to go to the city, and then walked over to the Exhibition Centre. We made our way over to the first talk, Anastasia Woolmer. Before her talk began, a dancer came onto the stage to teach us a dance. Then, they brought Anastasia to the stage.

Anastasia Woolmer is a two-time first place winner in memory sports, she was also the first woman to gain that title and has set multiple records. They brought a child from the crowd up onto the stage, to name 20 - 30 random numbers, and to write them onto the board; she turned away and named them all, then once again, backwards. She told us all a story about when she was younger and how horrible her memory was to the extent where her professor advised her to redo the last years of highschool, and about how she became a professional ballerina when she was younger.

After Anastasia Woolmer's talk we had a short break to have a snack, and to buy "The Halogen Pin" for 5 dollars at the front desk. Our 2nd talk began with Bryson Klein, a multiple time Australia Ninja Warrior grand finalist, who was also part of "The USA against the world" team where he won first place. He started by showing us some videos of him competing, told us about a story of a napkin he and his friends set on fire, yet it didn't burn that he thinks about before competing. He also shortly touched on the topic of his struggles with dyslexia.

Our 3rd talk was, Jane Bunn, a 7 network weather presenter and meteorologist. She spoke about how when she was a child she was confused by why in movies had snow on Christmas and she didn't. When she was older, she didn't know what to do workwise, so when she saw the snow, she decided she wanted to become a meteorologist.

She studied at Monash university, but they only had a small meteorology department in the maths building, so she moved to America. Once she was back in Australia, she became annoyed over the weather presenters changing her wording, causing the weather report to be different, so she became the presenter. Recently Jane Bunn made a picture story book about weather, which you could buy at the event.

We then had our last break. We all sat outside, eating, talking and pondering whether or not to go get our school's copy of Jane Bunn's book signed. After our 40-minute break was over, we went back to our seats for the 4th and final talk, Melissa Barbieri.

Once again, before a speaker came up onto the stage, we danced, then played a game of "Wax of Facts" where we were given a picture of a celebrity and had to guess whether or not it was wax sculpture or real person, or not, if you lost, you sat down. Melissa Barbieri, former Matildas captain, and goalie, one of Australia's most awarded female footballers, with over 86 games over 13 years, walked up to the stage.

She talked about how when she was a kid, there was no football club she could go to, so when her friend's dad coached the boys football team, she joined that one. Eventually she had to give up football, due to a passport issue. She tried a LOT of other sports, but they just didn't feel the same. Eventually she started again, on a girls team this time, but quit when training got hard. One day she was watching the olympics when she recognised the girls in a team, it was her teammates, she could've been at the olympics, but she wasn't, because she quit. She asked her mum if she was too old now, she wasn't, so she started football again. Eventually, she overworked herself, and got injured, to the point where she couldn't run the way she needed to for her football position. So, she had to do something else, so she did, but, it was still football, but now, she was a goalie. When she became captain everyone put who they thought should be captain, as well as their reasoning in a hat, Melissa had the most votes, she was captain.

After Melissa's talk, we left, went back through public transportation, back to school, and it was the end of the day, so we went home.

Dear Brunswick South West Primary School families,

The Smile Squad team from Merri Health are coming to our school soon. Smile Squad is the Victorian Government free school dental program. This means all students can get a free dental check-up, preventive services, and treatment at school.

How to access free dental care

We need your consent before we can provide services. Consent is usually provided by a parent or guardian. Sign up to Smile Squad at: <https://bit.ly/smilesquadvic> OR use the below QR code



Please complete and submit the consent form by Monday 15th of April. Paper copies of the consent form are available. Please contact the school office if you would like to request one.

The electronic consent form can be translated into more than 100 languages, and the paper form is available in 13 languages.

Smile Squad dental packs

All children deserve a healthy smile, and the Smile Squad free school dental program is working hard to help make sure this happens. Your child(ren) will soon receive a free dental pack to bring home. The dental pack contains a toothbrush, full sized toothpaste, and an oral health brochure. Please take the time to read the brochure. It's full of helpful hints and tips to help your whole family eat well, drink well and clean well – for life.

Standard strength toothpaste

Smile Squad provides standard strength fluoride toothpaste that is generally used by ages six and over, unless recommended by a dental or trained health professional. If your child is under six, please talk to a dental or trained health professional to find out if your child might benefit from using this toothpaste. You can also choose to put the toothpaste away until they turn six or give it to someone else in your family to use.

Do I need to attend my child's appointment?

No, you do not need to attend your child's appointment. You can attend if you would like to, and you can take your child to the community dental clinic if you prefer.
